Stats

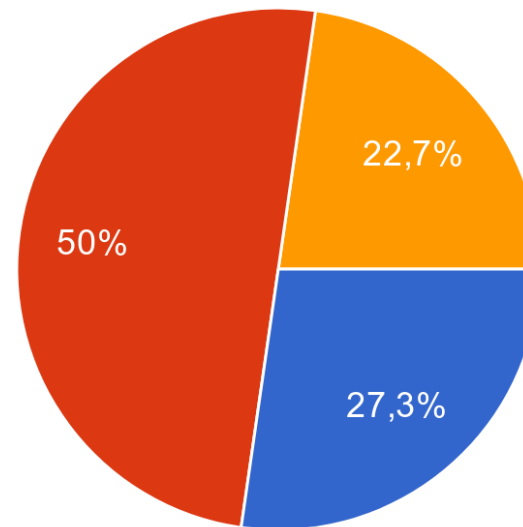
- Overwhelming majority of participants finished exercise successfully

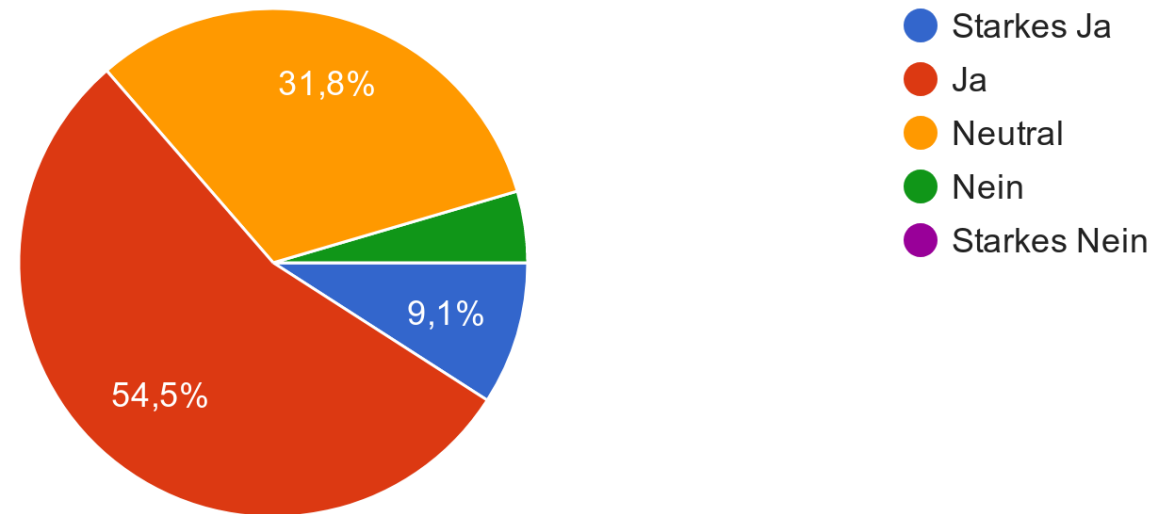


Requirements in tickets

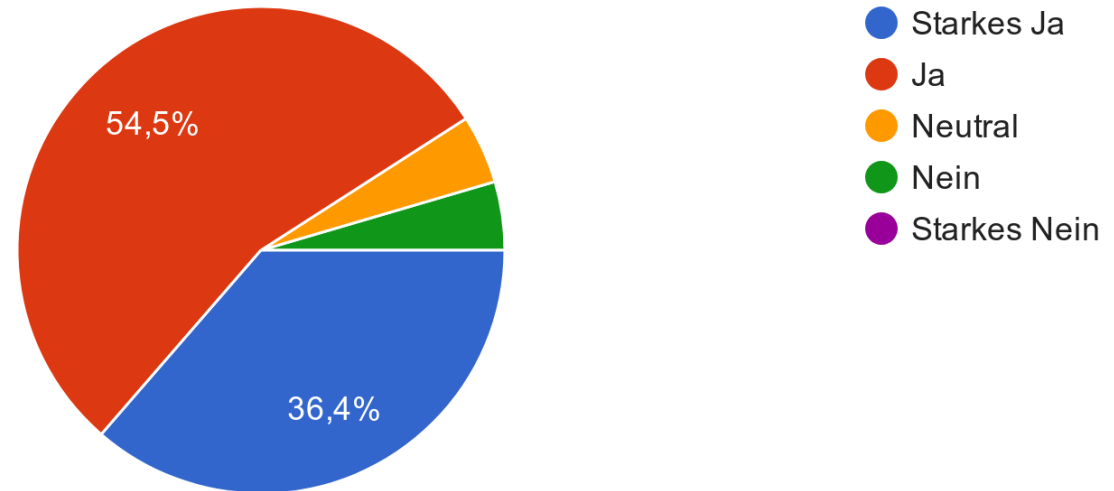


Working with tickets

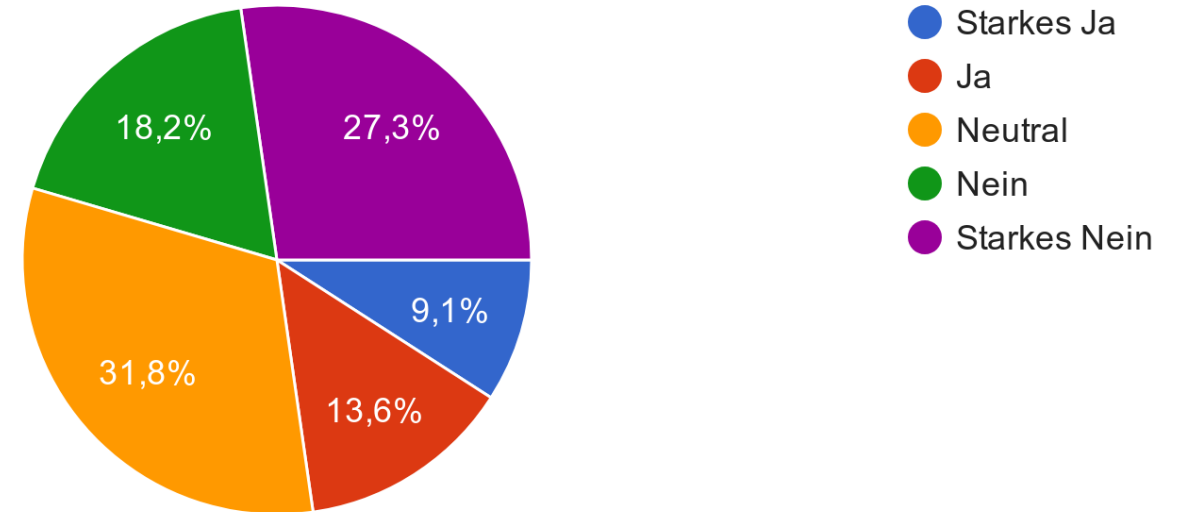


Full requirements at the start

Getting stuck

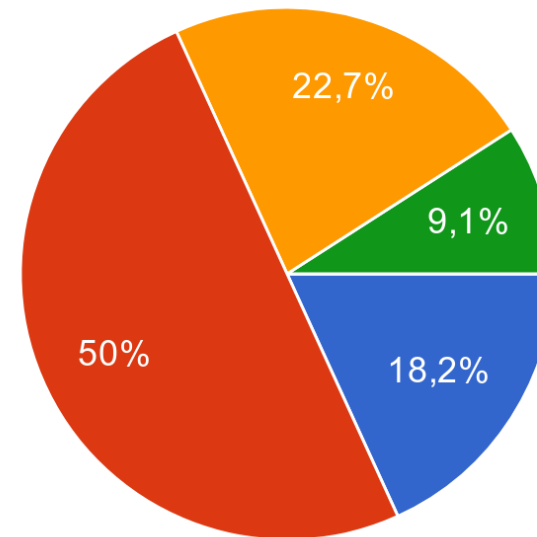
- **68,2% got stuck** along the way

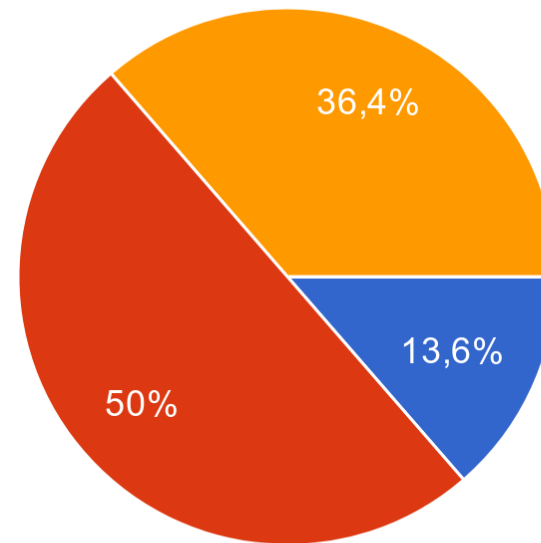

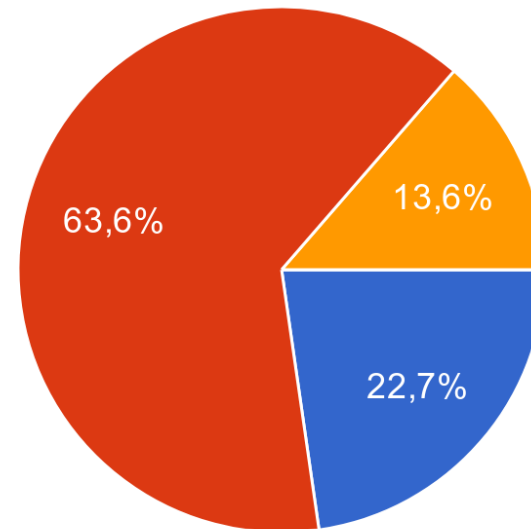
